(Honiara 02.09.16) - A team of Central Bank staff will attend the Alliance Financial Inclusion Global Policy Forum in Nadi, Fiji from 7-9 September.

The 2016 AFI Global Policy Forum will be hosted by the Reserve Bank of Fiji at Port Denarau.

According to the Manager of National Financial Inclusion Unit Caroline Kanoko, a large delegation is required to represent CBSI to participate in activities during the week.

"This is the first time CBSI will be represented by a delegation of more than 10 participants, along with 3 other representatives from SIG (MCILLI) and SIWIBA making it 13 in total."

The Forum sessions will explore the linkages between financial inclusion and sustainable development, which have been recognized globally through the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Addis Ababa Action Agenda on financing for development.

In line with the conference, AFI is also celebrating its independence as a fully member-owned organization. It is also the first time that AFI's landmark event comes to the Pacific region. Under the theme "Building the Pillars of Sustainable Inclusion" More than 200 participants from almost 60 countries have already confirmed their participation, including 26 Central Bank Governors and Deputy Governors.
