Is it Real? CHECK the NEW Bold, Wide Embedded Stripe

Our upgraded \$50 and \$100 retain the current banknote designs and are enhanced with the latest security technology. The \$50 and \$100 now feature an embedded 18mm wide, bold micro optic stripe that runs the full height of the banknote and is securely embedded into the paper. The new thread features the denomination, CBSI, the shark and crocodile from the Solomon Islands Coat of Arms. This replaces the transparent 'window' which appeared on the previous notes.



1. CHECK

Check for the NEW 18mm wide embedded stripe. There is a shark and crocodile from the Solomon Islands Coat of Arms, CBSI and either 50 or 100. The stripe covers the full height of the note and has vivid micro optic effects.



2. LOOK

Look for the watermark image of an eagle's head and the letters CBSI which can be clearly seen when the note is held up to the light.



3. FEEL

Feel the banknote and run your fingers over the words 'SOLOMON ISLANDS' for the familiar raised print of a genuine banknote.



If you are still unsure then compare the note with one that you know is genuine.
